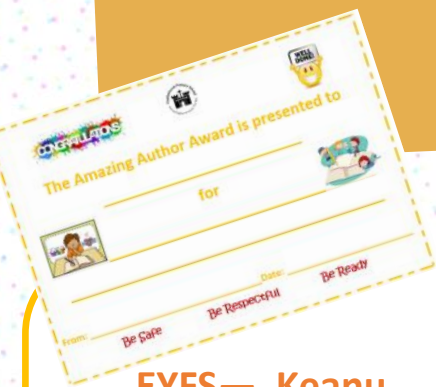
6th June is the 80th anniversary of the Battle of Normandy, the day in 1944 when Allied forces from thirteen different

Our whole school attendance target is **94.62 %.**

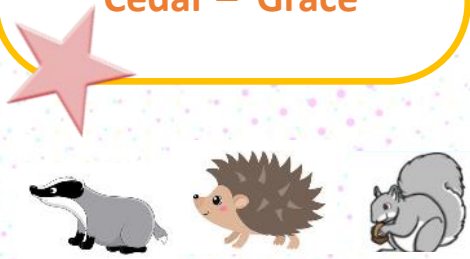

Monday: Own sports wear

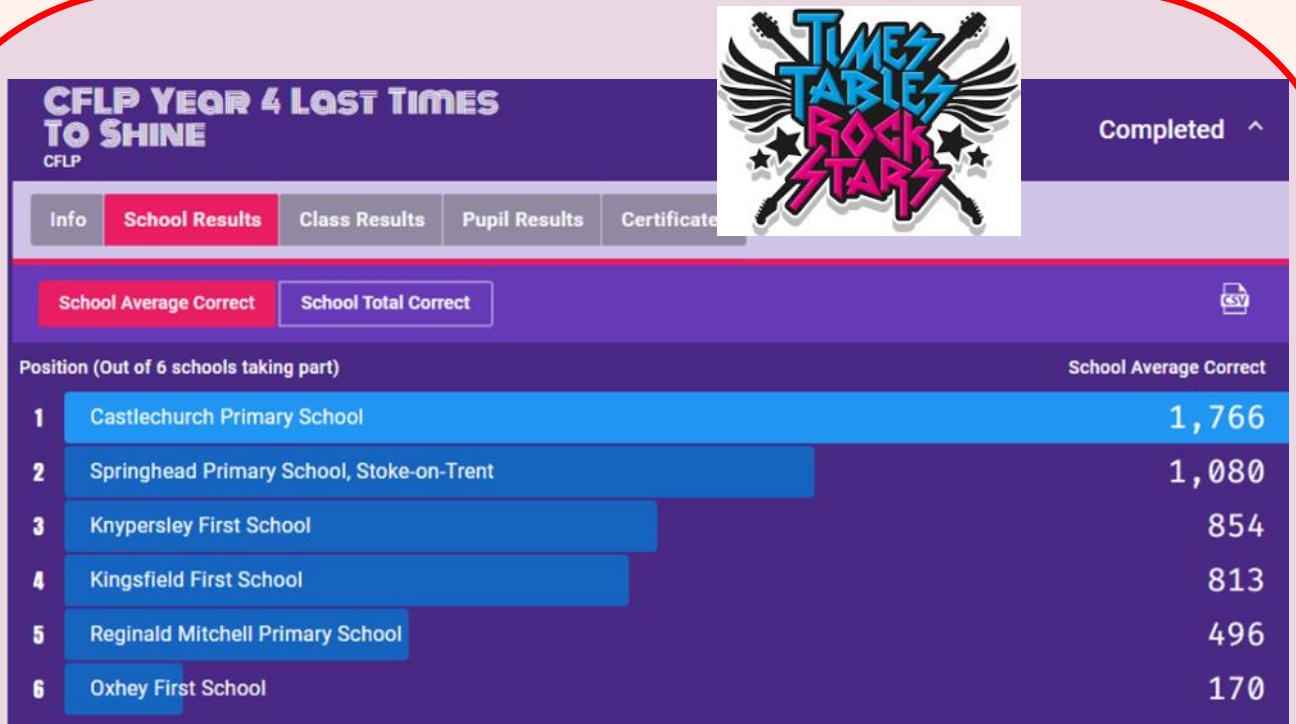
Tuesday: Football (football kits, tops etc) or own sports clothes
